

You can be part of the Stop and Search Scrutiny Panel for Sandwell and the Black Country to have your say on how the police operate in our community.

WHAT'S IT ABOUT?

This panel is all about giving young people like you a chance to:

- Learn about your rights.
- Understand how stop and search powers are used.
- Improve the relationship between the police and local communities.
- Making a real difference by sharing your views and helping to shape change.

HOW TO JOIN:

This is your chance to make a real impact, whilst developing and building your skills and experience.

WHY SHOULD YOU GET INVOLVED?

- Have a voice: Raise concerns and give feedback.
- Make a change: Help shape how stop and search powers are used in your community.
- Develop essential skills: communication, critical thinking, and leadership.
- Build confidence: Working with others to build trust between young people and the police.
- Get involved: Encourage your friends to take part too and make their voices heard. All great to add to your CV, future job or university application forms.

The panel will meet every 2 months, and refreshments will be provided!

WHAT HAPPENS AT THE PANEL?

You will:

- Watch real footage from body cameras worn by police officers.
- Review stop and search records.
- Share your opinions without fear of being judged.
- Take part in discussions and give honest feedback to help improve the police's actions.
